What is 'DEAL'?

**DEAL stands for
Developing Early identification and Access in Learning
Environments**

- **The focus of the study is on finding out about the best ways that schools can spot early signs of children's emotional health difficulties**
- **Through the most up to date research, we know that children who receive help sooner rather than later are more likely to recover quickly and are less likely to experience difficulties in the future**

Who is running this project?

**We are a team of researchers at the University of Cambridge.
We are interested in understanding how best to support the emotional health and wellbeing of children, young people and their families.**

Through the DEAL study we want to find out how best to support schools to spot the early warning signs of emotional difficulties so that children can get the right help as soon as possible.
