Updates from PHE's National Knowledge and Intelligence teams

Epidemiology and Surveillance

In line with the Official Statistics release cycle, on 7 February PHE will publish an update to the <u>Public Health Outcomes Framework (PHOF) data tool</u>. On the same day, the online <u>Health Profiles</u> and <u>Local Tobacco Control Profiles</u> will also be updated. The indicators updated or added are those where new source data have become available since the last quarterly update.

Risk Factors

- Local Authority HIV Sexual and Reproductive Health Epidemiology Reports (LASERs) are now available, via the password protected PHE HIV and STI portal. They bring together local HIV, sexual and reproductive health (HSRH) intelligence, for local authorities to identify burden, trends and population groups and geographical areas of greater need. They are produced to support LAs to identify priorities, to target sexual health promotion activity and to commission HSRH services. Unfortunately contraception data have not been made available to PHE in time to include in this version of the LASER, but will be added at a later date, likely in early 2017.

Health Intelligence Networks updates

National End of Life Care Intelligence Network (NEoLCIN)

- O PHE and NHS England have published an <u>Evaluation Report</u> and a <u>Guidance and definitions</u> document concerning the Palliative Care Clinical Data Set. These reports detail the new voluntary data set for specialist palliative care (SPC) services and the processes which have underpinned its development. The dataset supports local improvement of clinical care.

New 'Where to Look' packs published

NHS Right Care has <u>published new Commissioning for Value 'Where to Look' packs</u> for all Sustainability and Transformation Plan (STP) areas. These new products include aggregate data at STP level for all the CCGs that make up each footprint. The packs have been published to support STPs and their component organisations in ensuring there is a focus on the most appropriate pathways for planning purposes. In the medium to longer term, the data contained in the packs should also help to identify the biggest opportunities to improve outcomes and reduce spend as part of future work on planning and delivery.

Alcohol

 The <u>Independent</u>, the <u>BBC</u>, the <u>Guardian</u>, and the <u>Daily Mail</u> led with the review asserting the health benefits of introducing minimum pricing for alcohol and tackling how the manner in which alcohol is marketed by drinks firms could improve the

nation's health. Kevin Fenton, National Director of Health and Wellbeing at PHE, said: "The harm alcohol causes is much wider than just on the individual drinker. Excessive alcohol consumption can harm children, wreck families, impact on workplace colleagues and can be a burden and drain on the NHS and economy. It hits poor communities the hardest." Dementia

The Times reports that: "Dementia patients are spending millions of nights 'marooned' in hospital as a social care crisis means that 1 in 11 beds are now occupied by someone known to have the condition. Nights in hospital for people with dementia have increased by 20% since 2010 as a crumbling elderly care system struggles to keep people well at home."

Dental Health

 The <u>Daily Telegraph</u> reports that: "New guidance from the National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE) says teachers and school nurses should supervise teeth brushing in a bid to drive down rates of tooth decay." See PHE's <u>2015 Public Health England dental survey.</u>

Diet and nutrition

- A study from the School of Public Health at Imperial College has claimed that just a 1oz portion of nuts every day could be key in fighting a range of diseases, from heart disease to cancer. Researchers found that the daily serving cuts the risk of coronary heart disease by 30%, cancer by 15% and diabetes by nearly 40%, report the <u>Daily</u> <u>Telegraph</u>, the <u>Independent</u>, and the <u>Daily Mirror</u>.
- The Committee on Advertising Practice is extending a ban on advertising for food and drink aimed at children which are high in fat, salt or sugar to all media where under-16s make up 25% of the audience, reports <u>BBC News</u>. The new rules, which will come into effect on 1 July, bring non-broadcast media such as websites, social media, cinema and billboards in line with current restrictions on TV advertising.

Drug Treatment

The Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs (ACMD) has suggested that heroin is made available on prescription, reports the <u>Guardian</u> and the <u>Independent</u>. The UK's first 'fix room' for heroin addicts is to be opened in Glasgow, in response to a sharp rise in the number of heroin-related deaths in recent years. The ACMD said maintenance of drug treatment programmes was essential to prevent further increases. However, the Home Office said that the government had no intention of following up on the ACMD's recommendation.

Health and Wellbeing

- The <u>Guardian</u> reports that: "Clinics offering women contraception are closing or reducing their opening hours in the wake of heavy Whitehall cuts to local councils' public health budgets, new research has revealed. One and a half million women of reproductive age live in parts of England where councils have restricted contraception services or are considering doing so, according to data obtained under freedom of information by the Advisory Group on Contraception."
- The Sun, Daily Star and Mail on Sunday report that research scientists at the Karolinska Institute in Stockholm have suggested that just 10 puffs on an e-cigarette, also known as a 'vape', can be enough to increase the risk of developing heart disease. Commenting on the study Professor Kevin Fenton, PHE's National Director of Health and Wellbeing said: "The evidence remains clear, with PHE's most recent review and the Royal College of Physicians both finding that while not completely risk-free, vaping carries a fraction of the risk of smoking."

Mental Health

The Daily Mail reports on figures collated by mental health charity Mind using Freedom of Information requests to councils, concerning how much is being spent on promoting mental well-being and preventing mental health problems. The figures show that 13 local authorities spent nothing in 2015 to 2016 and that overall, councils spent 0.9% of their public health budget on prevention, down from 1.4% in 2013 to 2014.
