

Title	Health Survey for England
What is it?	The Health Survey for England is an annual survey, which also contains physical activity data alongside other indicators. The HSE is currently commissioned by the Information Centre (and before 2005 was commissioned by the Department of Health) to monitor the health of the population. This is currently the most robust data source to monitor trends in adult obesity and physical activity in England and includes nutrition data.

What does it contain?	The surveys in 2008 and 2012 contained an additional physical activity module, which is not included annually. Questions relate to the amount of time spent being physically active in the last four weeks, and are reported in terms of the governments recommendations (150 minutes per week measured in 10 minute bouts for adults, 60 minutes per day for children aged 5-15 years). Additionally questions are asked about sedentary time.

Title	Active People Survey
What is it?	The Active People Survey is a large telephone survey of sport and active recreation among adults (14+) in England, commissioned by Sport England. The survey provides the measurement for the former National Indicator 8 (NI8) - adult participation in sport and active recreation. Data on participation in sport are published by Sport England. Data published by Public Health England on the Public Health Outcomes Framework (PHOF) include a wider definition of physical activity including active travel.

What does it contain?	The survey measures participation in sport and active recreation, and provides details of how participation varies from place to place and between different groups in the population. The survey also measures other sport- related issues such as volunteering; club membership; tuition or coaching; and overall satisfaction with levels of sporting provision in the local community. The activities are measured in bouts of 10 minutes and include: sport, recreational cycling, recreational walking, walking for active travel purposes, cycling for active travel purposes, dance and gardening. Occupational activity or work in the home is not included.

Title	Labour Force Survey
What is it?	The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a quarterly sample survey of households living at private addresses in Great Britain. Its purpose is to provide information on the UK labour market that can then be used to develop, manage, evaluate and report on labour market policies. The questionnaire design, sample selection, and interviewing are carried out by the Social and Vital Statistics Division of the Office for National Statistics (ONS) on behalf of the Statistical Outputs Group of the ONS.

Title	Understanding Society
What is it?	Understanding Society, the UK Household Longitudinal Study (UKHLS), is a longitudinal survey of the members of approximately 40,000 households in the UK. Households recruited at the first round of data collection are visited each year to collect information on changes to their household and individual circumstances. Interviews are typically carried out face-to-face in respondents' homes by trained interviewers. Data collection for each wave takes place over a 24 month period and individual respondents are interviewed around the same time each year.

Title	Millenium Cohort Study
What is it?	The Millennium Cohort Study (MCS) is a multi-disciplinary research project following the lives of around 19,000 children born in the UK in 2000-01. The study has been tracking the Millennium children through their early childhood years and plans to follow them into adulthood. It collects information on the children's siblings and parents.

Aged seven (2008) had additional physical activity questions and asked days per week do sport/exercise, Frequency of non club/class physical activities, How often use a bicycle, any formal cycle training, journeys on foot (outside of school), journeys on bike (outside of school).

Title	General Lifestyle (Household) Survey
What is it?	The General Lifestyle Survey (GLF), formerly known as the General Household Survey (GHS) is a multi-purpose continuous survey carried out by the Social Survey Division of the Office for National Statistics (ONS) which collects information on a range of topics from people living in private households in Great Britain. The survey started in 1971 and has been carried out continuously since then, except for breaks in 1997/98 (when the survey was reviewed) and 1999/2000 when the survey was re-developed. The General Household Survey (GHS) was renamed the General Lifestyle Survey (GLF/GLS) in 2008.
