# NHS Lothian Winter Vaccines 2023/24

The following groups are eligible for vaccination against flu and COVID-19 this year:

- Frontline health and social care workers
- Residents and staff in care homes for older adults
- Those aged 65 and over.
- Those aged 6 months to 64 years of age at higher risk.
- Pregnant women
- Carers (including unpaid) aged 16-64
- Household contacts of those with a weakened immune system aged 12-64

#### **FLU ONLY**

Flu vaccines are being prioritised in September and NHS Scotland has contacted those who are eligible for a flu vaccine only. People aged 50-64 with no underlying health conditions and non-frontline health and social care workers are now being called forward for appointments, starting from 4 September. School children will also begin receiving their flu vaccines (nasal sprays) shortly.

#### **FLU AND COVID-19**

Invitations to people aged 65-74 years of age with no underlying conditions and those aged 12-64 years in a clinical risk group (excluding those with a weakened immune system) that leaves them at greater risk from COVID-19 will be the first to receive invitations for both flu and COVID-19 vaccines, with appointments starting from 18 September.

Invitations for all other priority groups receiving both flu and COVID-19 vaccines will follow as the programme progresses. This includes people in care homes and those aged 75 and over who will receive invitations for appointments starting from mid-October. Both groups were offered vaccination during the spring COVID-19 programme, so their immunity has received a recent boost. **Following final advice on the Winter Covid-19 booster programme from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI), unpaid carers can access an additional Covid-19 booster.** 

Clinical advice and evidence show that administration of both vaccines together is a safe and efficient way to deliver maximum protection.

People should wait for NHS Scotland to contact them with details of their appointment, or prompt to book.
