Report your result (positive, negative or void) every time you do a COVID-19 rapid lateral flow test at home or at work.

**How do I report a test result?**

**How do I take a lateral flow test?**

Taking a lateral flow test involves rubbing a long cotton bud (swab) over your tonsils (or where they would have been) and inside your nose, or inside your nose only (both nostrils).

The swab is dipped into an extraction solution. This is then dripped on to the device's test strip, producing the reaction that gives the result.

The tests give a quick result, as the sample does not need to be sent to a lab

**How to get regular rapid tests**

You can get rapid lateral flow test kits sent to your home. Order rapid lateral flow home test kits on GOV.UK

You can get up to 2 packs of 7 rapid tests from a local pharmacy.

If you give the pharmacy a 'collect code' when you pick up the tests, it helps the NHS match your details to the tests. Find out about collect codes and how to get a collect code on GOV.UK

**Why lateral flow tests are being offered?**

Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 do not have symptoms, so a test that rapidly detects these otherwise hidden cases is a very useful additional tool for tackling the virus.

**How often should I take a lateral flow test?**

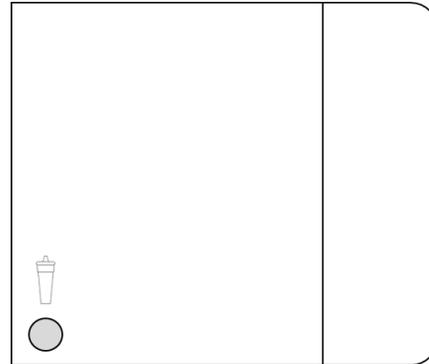
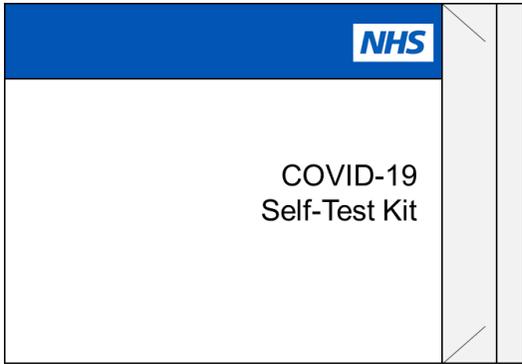
You should do a rapid test twice a week (every 3 to 4 days) to check if you have the virus. If people test positive and self-isolate, it helps stop the virus spreading.

Even if you're vaccinated, there's still a chance you can pass COVID-19 on, so you should keep getting tested regularly.

**How accurate are lateral flow tests?**

Research shows rapid tests are 99.9% accurate. This means the chance of getting a false-positive result (where the result shows as positive but is actually negative) is extremely low.

## What An LFD Testing kit contains:

1) An extraction tube holder

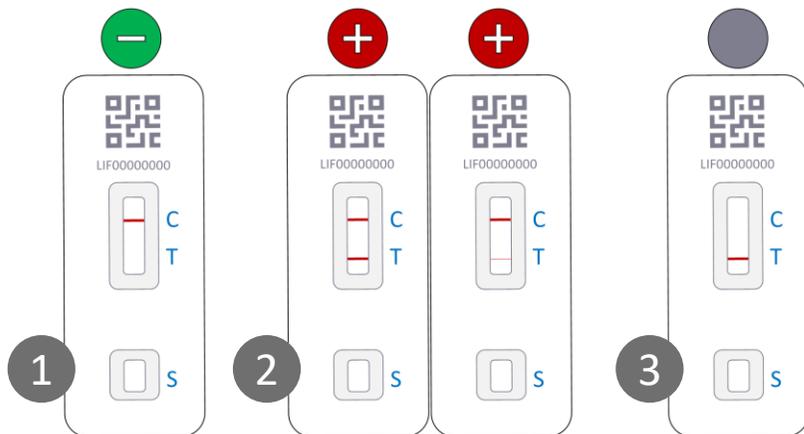
2) A test strip sealed in a plastic bag

3) An extraction buffer sachet of liquid

4) An extraction tube

5) A swab inside a sealed wrapper

6) A plastic bag to put the waste and packaging in



## Lateral flow test results

- 1) One line next to the C shows it is a negative result
- 2) Two lines - A line next to the C and another line next to the T shows a positive test result
- 3) No lines or one line only next to the T means the test is void
